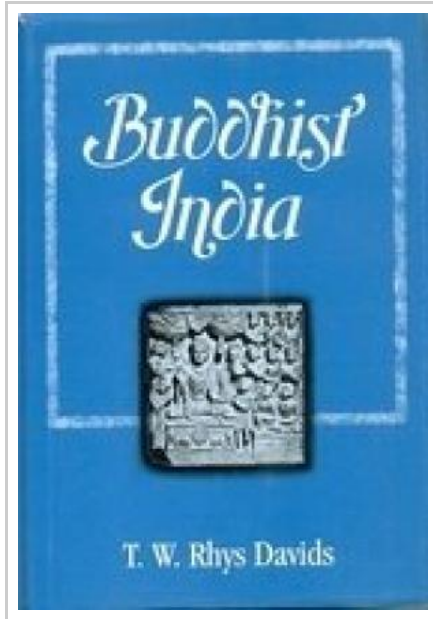




Buddhist India
